DISCUSSION GUIDE

- 1. Have you ever done "Ancestry.com" or something similar to learn about your ancestry? What did you learn?
- 2. Why do you think genealogies are included in the Bible, particularly in these chapters?
- 3. Read Genesis 4:19-24. What kind of "image" is Lamech portraying?
 - a. How does Lamech contrast with the "image" Jesus bears? (Read Matthew 18:21-22)
- 4. Read Genesis 5:21-24. What does it mean that Enoch "walked with God"? What do you imagine this included?
 - a. What are the marks of someone who "walks with God" in our culture today?
- 5. Read Genesis 5:28-29. How does Lamech's naming of Noah reflect his hopes and beliefs?
- 6. Who were the "Lamechs" and "Enochs" in your family tree? Are there any legacies of faith and/or failure that have played a part in how you live or see the world?
- 7. Look at the genealogy in Luke chapter 3 and notice that Luke includes this genealogy from Genesis 5. What can we learn about God's faithfulness in human history through these genealogies?
