DISCUSSION GUIDE

- Ennui means feeling really bored and tired of everything. It's when nothing seems fun or interesting, and you just don't know what to do with yourself. Share a story of when you have experienced this. Do you feel this way currently?
- 2. Read Ecclesiastes 1:1-11. What are some modern-day pursuits that people chase for meaning and satisfaction? What are some things you have chased that turned out to be "vapor"?
- 3. Read Ecclesiastes 2:17-23. What frustrations does Solomon express about work and toil (Ecclesiastes 2:17-23)?
 - a. How do you feel about your own work and its lasting impact?
 - b. The 15^{-th} century Reformation leaders saw an occupation as a ministry before God. Jobs should be acknowledged as ministries, and workplaces should be considered mission fields. What do you think about this idea?
- 4. Read Ecclesiastes 2:1-11. What pleasures did Solomon pursue?
 - a. Have you ever experienced the "morning after" feeling of getting everything you wanted? How did it feel?
 - b. What does it mean to delight in God?
- 5. What is eternal life according to John 17:3?
 - a. How does the psalmist express his longing for God in Psalm 42:1-5?
 - b. What habits or life rhythms help you find purpose/satisfaction in God? How does being in a LifeGroup and serving others help us in this pursuit?

Together, reflect on the study and the areas of your life where you may be experiencing ennui or dissatisfaction.
